

Héctor Moya Martín
President of the Association of Urban Surface Transport Concessionaries

Mr. Moya started working in the freight industry in 1975.

Between 1980 and 1994 he was CEO of Transportes Frigoríficos Moya Ltda., a company dedicated to the transport of perishable goods in refrigerated trucks. Initially, its main routes were Santiago-Arica and Santiago-Chiloé.

During this period he entered the international freight business, opening routes to Buenos Aires (Argentina), Montevideo (Uruguay), Asunción (Paraguay) and Sao Paulo (Brazil).

He also started participating in Chilean freight unions. In 1981 he was elected Vice-President of the Confederation of Truck Owners of Chile.

He has held different positions in freight unions, being chosen in 1998 as President of the Confederation of Truck Owners and President of the Chilean Federation of Transport Unions, which organizes unions from different areas such as urban transit, freight, taxis and others.

In 1999 he founded and was elected President of CONAPYME, a labor-union organization that represents small businesses, including unions from the commercial sector, freight, urban bus transit, agriculture, interurban transport, exporters, etc.

In 2002 Mr. Moya helped create the National Institute of Transport and presided it for three years. This organism studies different transportation modes and trains small businesspeople in the transport area.

During 2004 he participated in the creation of SUBUS Chile, heading it since its beginnings until September 2012. This company, dedicated to the transport of passengers in Santiago, was created to participate in the first Transantiago tender. Currently, it operates 1,260 buses and works with 6,000 people.

During January 2005 SUBUS Chile was allotted Trunk N°2 and signed a 15-year contract with the Chilean Ministry of Transport and Telecommunications.

Since October 2012 he works as Director of METBUS, a company that operates Transantiago's Trunk N°5. METBUS has a fleet of 928 buses, serving 12 communes in Santiago with 52 lines.

In December 2013 the Association of Urban Surface Transport Concessionaries (ACTUS A.G.) was created, a union that groups six out of seven companies that operate lines under the Transantiago system. Mr. Moya was elected President of ACTUS for the 2013-2015 periods. This union represents companies that operate 6,000 buses in 32 communes in the Metropolitan Region of Santiago.
